Happy Friday CRR!

We'd like to thank everyone who came out for the Coosawattee Blood Drive. While we wish we had a larger turn out, we're very appreciative of those who took time out of their day to be involved in something so impactful that it could save a life.







This week will be the final reminder for the upcoming Coosawattee Community Line Dancing Class at the Water Tower on Thursday, June 30th beginning at 7:30pm. Details were in the newsletter last week. This week is also the final reminder to support the Coosawattee Community Food Drive! This has been a fantastic success already, but you can be part of a strong finish by dropping off literally any food for people or animals at either the POA offices or the Rec Center. Thank you so much to everyone who has donated and made an impact on their local area neighbors.

Community Clean Up event last Saturday. There were a couple snags and I want to be clear on what happened.

The first problem is that we had the vendor drop off the dumpsters at the end of the day on Friday. Rather than wait until the next morning when the event was actually scheduled to begin and CRR crews were on hand to assist, people proceeded to dump anything and everything, including items on the prohibited list, in the middle of the night. By the time CRR staff arrived in the morning both dumpsters we had brought in were beyond fill capacity. If you were one of the people who arrived that morning and were upset that the dumpsters were already full, this is why.



This isn't the sort of thing I would normally mention in this newsletter, but I heard more than a few reports that residents were angry and blaming the Association or the staff for this as if it was their fault and that is simply not the case. As a matter of fact, in response, the staff pulled a third dumpster out that is always on site and is used by CRR which filled up immediately.

Next, they cleared space inside the fenced area and assisted the people arriving in just dumping everything on the ground.





Then on Monday they had the company come out, haul away the full dumpsters, bring them back, pick up everything off the ground, haul them away again, and rinse and repeat until everything had been cleared. That ended up being quite a lot because not only did people not wait until the event began to start dumping, they didn't quit when it was over. People continued dumping Saturday during the night all the way through Monday morning.

The second problem was that one of the largest sources of items being dumped were from builders, contractors, and commercial business operations, which is not what this event is supposed to be for. It really should go without saying, but the event was intended for residents, not contractors, not builders, not remodeling businesses, not junk removal companies, but residents to dispose of unwanted items.

We didn't have either of these issues with the last clean up event so we didn't expect these problems, but we will take steps to ensure we don't run into this again.

We recently experienced a dire situation with the ducks at the pond by the POA. A duck rescue expert was brought in to assess the situation. These were domestic ducks introduced into the pond. Domestic ducks are completely dependent on humans for care and feeding. Domestic ducks are not built to fly and therefore are easy prey for fox, racoons, owls, coyotes, dogs, etc. Many of the ducks present were under weight and/or injured. It usually does not end well for domestic animals to be introduced into a wildlife environment. Please, let wildlife *be* wildlife.
