A Message From Your Environmental Conservation Committee

Septic System Care

The average household septic system should be inspected at least every 3 years by a septic service professional. Household septic tanks are typically pumped every 3-5 years.

Four major factors influence the frequency of pumping:
Household size; total wastewater generated; volume of solids in wastewater & septic tank size.

- When you call a septic service provider, he/she will inspect for leaks examine the scum & sludge layers in your septic tank.
- Keep maintenance records on work performed on your septic system.
- Your septic tank includes a T-shaped outlet which prevents sludge and scum from leaving the tank and traveling to the drain field area. If the bottom of the scum layer is within six inches of the bottom of the outlet, or if the top of the sludge layer is within 12 inches of the outlet, your tank needs to be pumped.
- To keep track of when to pump out your tank, write down the sludge and scum levels found by the septic professional.

The service provider should note repairs completed & the tank condition in your system's service report. If other repairs are recommended, hire a repair person soon.
