Note From the General Manager's Office

Greetings,

We hope everyone is enjoying the changing weather and looking forward to all the upcoming fall events and activities.

We are excited to share that paving progress continues! The reconstruction on Nexus is well underway and stabilization is almost complete. The next phase of this project (THE ACTUAL PAVING) will commence as soon as the foundation has been completed and inspected.

So, what is the next step? Well, we have some "Bad News"... We are shutting down yet another road... Sorry? Please be aware that Newport Dr. will be closed between Fife Bridge and Moonstone Dr. beginning Wednesday 10/19 through Friday 11/4 for construction. Please plan an alternate route during this construction window.

We are also in process of a behind the scenes upgrade. In last month's meetings The Finance Committee and Board approved a substantial computer server upgrade to better support the POA's IT network. This is an integral part of the association's support services...Websites, Central, Gates, Accounting, Camera Monitoring...Just about everything will be affected by this improvement.

A Message From Your Environmental Committee

Feeding deer can be harmful to the environment. Deer that usually roam a wide area will spend most of their time near an artificial food source. This will lead to the overgrazing of our forest understory of tree seedlings, shrubs, and wildflowers which will have long term negative ecological effects:

- We put our Coosawattee environment at risk. Runoff in our forest causes the washing away of topsoil and nutrients further contributing to the lack of understory vegetation leading to more erosion. The cycle of harm to our natural forest environment continues.
- Deer can also disrupt wildlife communities - such as forest songbirds and small mammals - by eating away their habitat. Removing the forest understory removes food source and protection from predators.

Many people enjoy seeing white-tailed deer up close, and

feel good about providing an easy meal. Unfortunately, despite the good intentions and immediate pleasure you get, in the long run feeding deer causes more harm than good. Take a walk in the spring and summer in the forests outside of Coosawattee where there is a natural deer population. Then drive along the roads in Coosawattee where there are only trees and non-native invasive plants and see what natural beauty we are missing.

Please, let wildlife *be* wildlife.

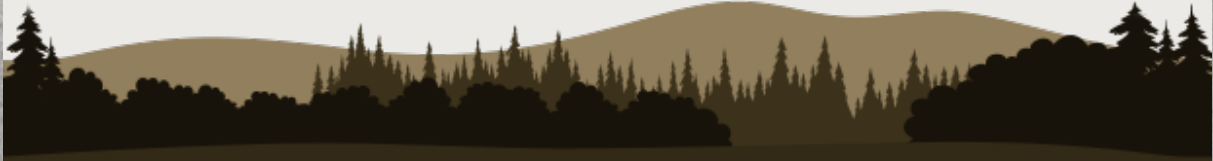
